It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

Renewals

Remember to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications. Please email or, **if mailing, send a stamped self-addressed envelope with the VicRoads Renewal form.** No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders. Please do not request the Committee to mail your renewal and payment to VicRoads.

You are always welcome to take your renewal paperwork to a monthly MMCCV meeting for an approval signature by the CPS Officer or Committee Members.

New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles)

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via cash or cheque to the MMCCV Secretary or a Committee member at MMCCV monthly meetings. There is no 6-month membership qualification time for any Morris Minor vehicle for new members.

When applying for a permit for a:

Morris Minor

Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following two **VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

Non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles

Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant. Members wanting to register a **non-Morris** Minor or motorcycle must have been a member of our Club for at least 6 months.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor vehicle applications must include (6) recent photos:

Motorcycle photos should include 1,2 & 5 (above) plus LHS RHS views and speedo.

Mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You must notify The Committee of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email to morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com . Failure to notify the Committee of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

HELD AT THE HORRIE WATSON HALL, DEEPDENE AND ALSO VIA ZOOM ON THURSDAY 12th OCTOBER 2023

The Meeting was opened by our President. Stewart Carr who welcomed all members. Meeting commenced at 8.00pm

Committee Members Present: President, Stewart Carr, Vice President: Russell Hatton; Club captain, Mark Bosley; Regalia Officer, Alan Todd; Treasurer, Katie Hamilton and Editor, Barbara Went.

Attendance: Approximately 20 members were present together with some members via Zoom.

Apologies: Geoff Shepherd, Ed James, Jim Gourlay, Percy & Cheryl Scicluna, Catriona Bruce.

Acceptance of Minutes: Minutes of the previous meeting held 14th September 2023 accepted on the motion of Mike Dobson and seconded by Trevor Sarbach.

President's Report: As per the Generator. There are still vacancies for a Club Librarian and a Web Master. Members are encouraged to think about volunteering for these interesting positions.

Vice President's Report: Russell reported the pleasure he had reading Chester McKaige's letter that was published in the most recent edition of The Generator and prompted him to reminisce about some of the wonderful times he had when the Club was in its infancy. This included a very entertaining story that involved the Midland Hotel and some goldfish!

He also talked about fitting exhaust extractors to his car which is working well. He got these from Sprite Parts and cost approximately \$400.

Secretary's Report: Our Secretary Ed James was absent but advised that there was an error in last month's minutes. They should have said the Club Captain, Mark Bosley was going to research new CB radios.

Treasurer's Report: Katie Hamilton reported that we have a current cheque account balance of \$4895.33. With our term deposit of \$8,733.38. We have a combined balance of our accounts of \$13,628.71. The club's insurance is due and has increased by \$150. We have purchased 3 new tables, and Katie is negotiating to have the old tables disposed of.

Katie has been in touch with the Manningham club and advised the following:

- 2 course meal is \$43.00. The Committee agreed to subsidize the meal and members will only have to pay \$35.00 a head. The option of 2 desserts should be made available.

Membership Officer's Report: As per the Generator. No new members this month. Total of 180 members. The Club Boards have been updated and are hanging in the Club Rooms.

Club Captain's Report: Mark reported that he has researched the best options for new CB radios. The GME kit are 5 volts with 12-volt chargers. They come with 2 handsets, microphones, ear pieces and cover an area of 5kms. Cost \$490 (including GST) for the kit. Fully serviceable and come in high visibility colours. The current CB radios only function over a 1 kilometre radius, which is not appropriate if out on a run.

1. Morrykhana – 29 October at Roxburgh Park College. RSVP to Stewart Carr by the 13th October at the latest.

2. Cup Day- Mark will liaise with Eric Holten regarding the run to confirm his ability to co-ordinate it. Mark will take one of the MMCCV flags so the spot for the picnic is easily identifiable.
3. Christmas Dinner – at Manningham Club
4. Possibility of a midweek run in late October. Mark will confirm closer to the date, likely to be to the Studley Park Boat Shed.

Editor's Report: The MMCCV Calendars will be available at the November meeting and will be approximately \$20.00 each.

CPS Officer's Report: Stewart Carr for Geoff Shepherd. There have been 2 members who hadn't paid for the past year's registration (Club Plates). This meant a lot of extra work including a new roadworthy certificate and photos.

Regalia: Grille badges art work is complete with the correct date (1977). They will cost \$25.00 to members. Alan will order 50.

Alan and Leigh Wallace have been working together and the Inaugural combined MMCCV and MG Car Club swap meet will occur on Saturday 24th February 2024 at the MG Club rooms. Commencing at 7am and finishing round 2pm. Any club member can purchase a spot for \$20 or 2 spots for \$40. This will be a great opportunity for all members. 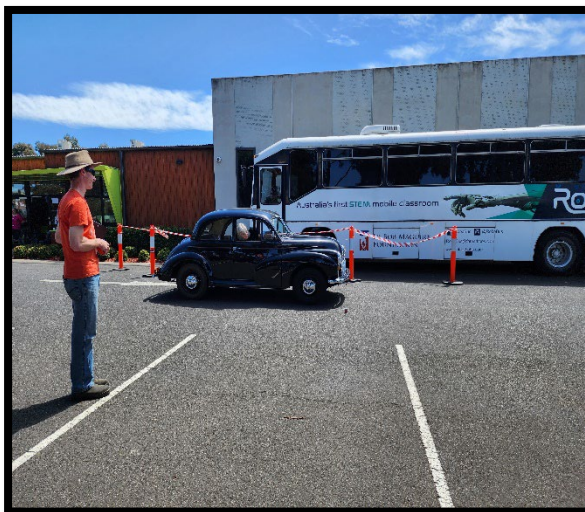

The Florence Thomson Tour is proudly brought to you by the Association of Motoring Club (AOMC) on behalf of RACV In February 1905, Florence Thomson was the sole female entrant in the Dunlop Reliability Motor contest from Sydney to Melbourne. Mrs Thomson was one of the 16 entrants who successfully completed the five-day trial, driving a six horsepower Wolsley, over what was then nothing more than 362 miles of dirt track between the capital cities.

To celebrate the pioneering spirit and contribution of women to Australian motoring, The Florence Thomson Tour was created as an annual event in April 2017 by the RACV.

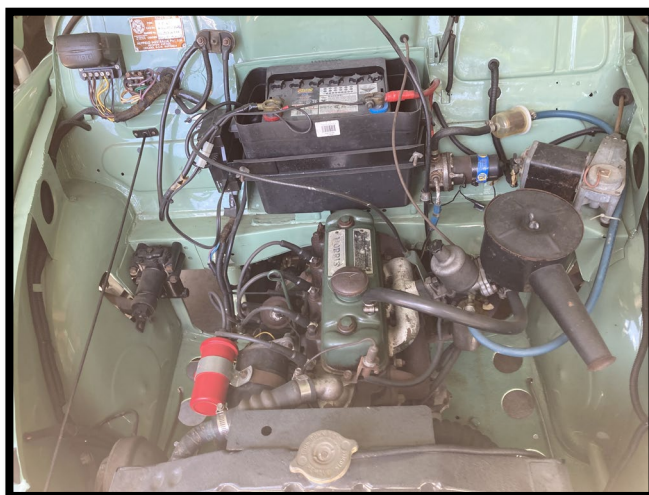

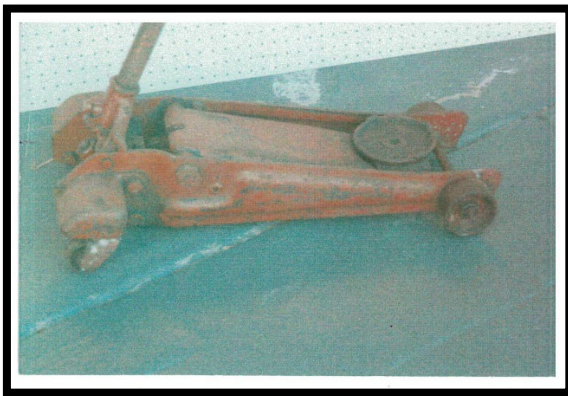

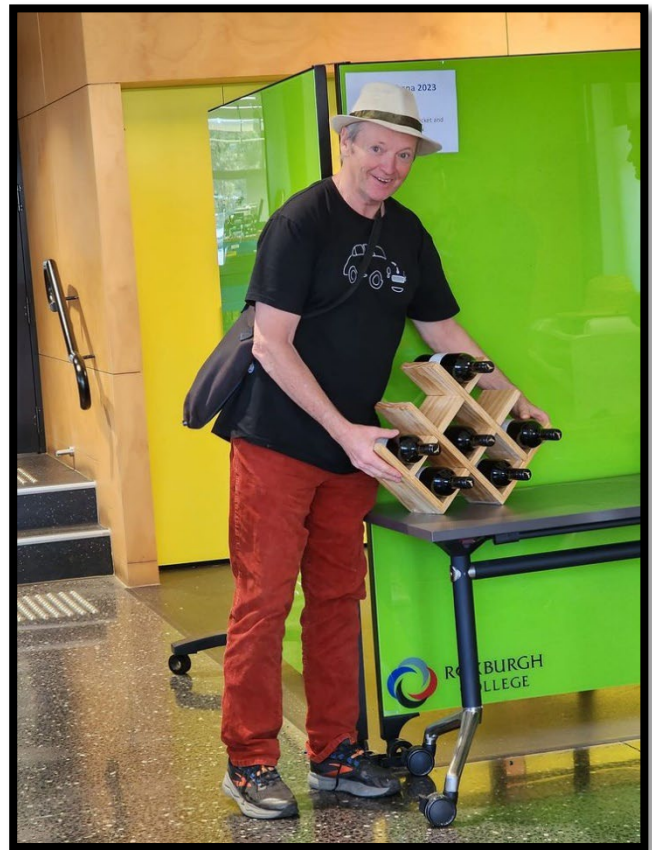
