FOR QUICK TURNAROUND OF APPLICATIONS AND RENEWALS PLEASE EMAIL AND SCAN DOCUMENTS WHERE POSSIBLE

It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

#### **New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles)**

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the MMCCV to the MMCCV Bank Account. There is no 6-month membership qualification time for any Morris Minor vehicle for new members.

When applying for a permit for a:

#### **Morris Minor**

Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

#### **Non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles**

Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant. Members wanting to register a **Non-Morris** Minor or motorcycle must have been a member of our Club for at least 6 months.

#### All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor vehicle applications must include (6) recent photos:

- 1. Vehicle front
- 4. Vehicle driving position (side on, driver's door open)
  - 2. Vehicle rear
  - 5. Chassis no or ID plate
  - 3. Vehicle driver's side
  - 6. Vehicle engine bay

**Motorcycle photos should include** 1,2 & 5 (above) plus LHS RHS views and speedo. Mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify The Committee of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email to <a href="mailto:morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com">morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com</a>. Failure to notify the Committee of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

#### Renewals

Remember to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications. Please email or, **if mailing, send a stamped self- addressed envelope with VicRoads**Renewal form. No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders. Please do not request the Committee to mail your renewal and payment to VicRoads.

#### **Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities**

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

I'm writing to thank you for your excellent work in publishing the September 'Generator', which brought back some fond memories. Firstly, the picture of a young Ross Carr on the cover. I had many dealings with Ross and Anne, at one stage working for Ross BT (before twins), and I suppose I got to see their evolution. Certainly gave Robert Mackie something to worry about!

Then I saw the photograph of Mark Bosley. Mark goes back to the early days of the club. I used to hand-deliver the 'Generator' to our thirty-odd members and always enjoyed visiting the Bosley house in Richmond. Mark's dad was an upholsterer who made a new bench seat for my ute. You could always get a good cuppa from Mrs.B when visiting.

Then, there was Russell Hatton and his brother Murray. They both worked in their uncle's garage in Hughesdale. It was always a hive of activity, but Saturday mornings were the best time to call. I watched Russell build that sedan of his up in record time so he could go to Swan Hill. As he didn't have a license, he engaged Neville Suckling to drive it there and back.

That car was a testament to Russell's mechanical ability. It looked good, went well and, above all, was comfortable. It was one of the 'better' executed modified cars in the Club back then.

Then there's Geoff Shepherd, the founder and first President, now the permit guru. Geoff originally had the idea for catering only to low lights, but there was so much interest In Series II and 1000s. If it weren't for Geoff, then I wouldn't be writing this. Back then, we young kids got away with things you couldn't do today. I cringe when I think of some things we got up to. I still don't know what happened to the goldfish and tank in the hotel at Castlemaine or running a hill climb up Mt. Tarrangower on a Saturday afternoon, contesting with the public out for a scenic drive. And to boot, the local newspaper put an article on page three with a picture of Robert Mackie and a stopwatch on the top of Mt. Tarrangower!

Yep, plenty of good memories.

### **AUSTRALIA STEALS NEW ZEALAND MINORS! – BY ANDREW DYER**

When I arrived in New Zealand in 2015, I soon learned about the friendly rivalry between NZ and Australia and all the "fush & chup" type banter that goes with it! However, whilst I realise that the Cold War was developing in Europe in the early 1950s, what I didn't know was that things were also coming to a head on this side of the world when Australia stole 96 Morris Minors from us in 1952.

Please don't take me too seriously – this information was obtained from a recent visit to the Archives at the British Motor Museum in the UK, where for geeky person like me, the records make fascinating reading.

I have been researching details of the CKD (Complete Knock Down) cars which left the Cowley factory as kits to be assembled in other countries. In the early days, New Zealand, Australia, India, South Africa, Ireland and The Netherlands all assembled Morries from these CKD kits. All the early CKD cars were 2-door saloons and then from March 1951 4-door cars were also available.

The cars were supplied in batches with allocated chassis numbers out of sequence to the UK assembled cars. The batches were irregular in size ranging from a dozen cars to over 100 in a single batch. The records show regular batches of Series MM cars being dispatched to New Zealand from Cowley from December 1948 until March 1952. Then things all went funny!

On 28 March 1952 a batch of 49 two-door cars left Cowley for Auckland in the normal way. However, the same week an accompanying batch of 48 four-door cars have a strange entry in the ledger. The letters NZ are crossed out and the words "Transferred to Australia 2 July 52" are substituted. Two weeks later on 10 April 1952 exactly the same thing happened. 48 two-door cars were sent to Auckland, but the accompanying 48 four-doors were again transferred to Australia on 2 July.

There is of course a three-month gap between the Cowley dispatch date and the "transferred to" date, so were the cars actually diverted from Cowley in an Aussie coup, or did they arrive in Auckland only to be sent on to Sydney because the kind Kiwis wanted to help their Australian cousins out?

There then followed a six-month period where no CKD kits were sent to NZ (the next batch was dispatched on 4 October 1952) but loads of cars were sent to Australia.

Why were these cars transferred to Australia? Why was there a six-month gap in CKD dispatches to New Zealand? Were Dominion Motors concentrating on other things or had they run out of funds or import licences?.....in which case the Aussies were helping out by taking them off our hands! Were the 96 cars replaced from Australian stocks during the winter of 1952 or should we be raising a formal complaint against our Aussie cousins at the International Court of Justice?!

The answer to all these questions is that we will never know. The chances of anyone who worked at the Newmarket, Auckland or Zetland, Sydney plants in 1952 still being around is slim, so we will just have to guess and make up silly stories about theft like this one!



## FLORENCE THOMSON

Tour

The Florence Thomson Tour is proudly brought to you by the Association of Motoring Club (AOMC) on behalf of RACV In February 1905, Florence Thomson was the sole female entrant in the Dunlop Reliability Motor contest from Sydney to Melbourne. Mrs Thomson was one of the 16 entrants who successfully completed the five-day trial, driving a six horsepower Wolseley, over what was then nothing more than 562 miles of dirt track between the capital cities.

To celebrate the pioneering spirit and contribution of women to Australian motoring, The Florence Thomson Tour was created as an annual event in April 2017 by the RACV.


