It is the Club Member's responsibility to send renewals and applications in a timely manner.

New Permits (Morris Minor and non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles)

You must be either a life member or financial (paid up) member before you can apply for a new permit. An application fee of \$20 is required. Payment can be made via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) to the MMCCV to the MMCCV Bank Account. There is no 6-month membership qualification time for any Morris Minor vehicle for new members.

When applying for a permit for a:

Morris Minor

Email or mail a copy of the vehicles current RWC, proof of ownership and the following **(2) VicRoads forms** 1. Club Permit Application form 2. Vehicle Eligibility and Standards Declaration for Club Permit Scheme Vehicle form.

Non-Morris Minor Vehicles and Motorcycles

Applications must be accompanied by all the above plus proof of current registration of a Morris Minor vehicle held in the name of the applicant. Members wanting to register a **Non-Morris** Minor or motorcycle must have been a member of our Club for at least 6 months.

All Morris Minor and Non-Morris Minor vehicle applications must include (6) recent photos:

1. Vehicle front
2. Vehicle rear
3. Vehicle driver's side
4. Vehicle driving position (side on, driver's door open)
5. Chassis no or ID plate
6. Vehicle engine bay

Motorcycle photos should include 1,2 & 5 (above) plus LHS RHS views and speedo.

Mailed photos should be signed and dated on back. Electronic photos are authenticated by email date.

You **must** notify The Committee of your red plate permit number within 48 hours of VicRoads issue via email to morrisminorclubplates@gmail.com. Failure to notify the Committee of your club permit number can have serious consequences for the Club and may cause the Club's permit scheme to be suspended by VicRoads for failure to keep up to date records.

Renewals

Remember to sign your renewal application. If your application is not signed it will be returned to you. No photos are required for renewal applications. Please email or, **if mailing, send a stamped self- addressed envelope with VicRoads Renewal form.** No renewal reminders will be issued to permit holders. Please do not request the Committee to mail your renewal and payment to VicRoads.

Rules Regarding Club CPS Responsibilities

A vehicle is not eligible for a Club Permit if any of the following conditions exist:

The member has ceased to be financial.

The vehicle is being used for commercial gain.

The vehicle is unroadworthy.

The vehicle is sold with logbook and plates.

The vehicle is sold to a friend so that a new logbook might be obtained.

VICE PRESIDENT – Russell Hatton:

I first joined the MMCCV back in 1978, not long after the club was created. My older brother Murray had an early series two Minor and following in his footsteps, I wanted a Morrie as my first car. Although I didn't have a licence I purchased a 1956 four door sedan, when I was aged of 15.

My plan was to have the car restored and ready for when I turned 18. There was also another deadline looming as the MMCCV had organised a weekend away to Swan Hill. As I was still on my learners permit I arranged for my friend Neville Suckling to drive the vehicle on this run. The vehicle had been stripped for repainting and some interior work and also an engine and gearbox transplant. I recall that about 3 weeks prior to the run that Chester Mc Kaige called around for a visit to check on how the car was progressing. On seeing the car with much work still to be done, Chester thought that it was extremely unlikely that the Morrie would be attending the event.

Well, as many of us would know, there's nothing like an important deadline to get the motivation inspired. Somehow this now, 17 year old apprentice motor mechanic managed to get the car completed and ready for the run, much to the surprise of Chester and a few others. Not only was the vehicle ready to embark on the run but it made it to Swan Hill and back without a hitch. So surprised was Chester that on the Saturday night's dinner, he awarded me a leather key pouch as recognition of a job well done. I actually still have that key pouch today.

Not having much knowledge of Morries or cars in general when I purchased the car, there was a number of valuable lessons learnt along the way in re-building my first vehicle. Whilst the car had great reliability I was totally unaware as to how underpowered the 803 engine was and the biggest lesson or maybe mistake was fitting a 3.7:1 ratio differential. Whilst cruising on the flat roads to Swan Hill the vehicle cruised along nicely, however when you hit a hill the fun began. We were often back to 2nd gear to climb a hill that a modern car wouldn't even know was there.

This was where the idea of fitting a larger engine came into play. Murray had purchased a Datsun 1600 as a wreck. As the months were counting down until I could get my licence, this set me another deadline to meet. The task, to fit a Datsun 1600 engine and gearbox into a Morrie. At this time an

engine swap like this had never been done. Most people were opting for the smaller Datsun 1200, Cortina/Escort or even Corolla motors. After much messing around the 1600 was fitted and very proudly without cutting into the bulkhead which was commonly done to fit larger engines but was not the best approach as it impacted a structural part of the car.

The Morrie was back on the road in time for me to use as my first car when I received my driver's licence. This was the car I used as a daily driver and it also regularly attended MMCCV runs for the next couple of years. Unfortunately, the car was hit on the front right corner while parked which caused extensive damage to both chassis rails and also distorted the bulkhead which left the car a write off. For many years to follow I attended club events in an honorary Morrie (as we called them back then). I purchased a number of Morries over the years to use as a replacement but always ended up repairing them and on selling them rather than using them myself. Finally I purchased one to keep and I still have that one today. It's a 1959 two door sedan. It was in need of some work of which I started on but other priorities meant that it has been sitting untouched in my garage for nearly 30 years.

In the mid 90's my focus altered, as did that of many of my friends in the club, to other aspects of life, particularly work and family. Fast forward 20 or so years and my eldest daughter Alaina has just turned 21 and is studying at University and Elise is 18 and in her final year at secondary school (year12). Last year I decided that the time was right to get involved in the club again and the first thing I wanted to do was attend this year's National Rally in South Australia. Due to work commitments I had never been able to attend the interstate rallies so it was fantastic to be able to be a part of this one.

Whilst I also have a number of other cars and motorcycles, the Morrie is the one that needs the most work. As the others are now fairly much up to scratch, it's the Morries turn to pick up where I left off all those years ago. It won't be a modified vehicle other than a few bolt on go faster bits as I'm all about keeping it simple these days.

There's no doubt that Morris Minors have been a big part of my life but the most rewarding part of it for me is the friendships with other Morrie owners I've made along the way. I'm still in contact with many of the members from the late 70's and 80's and have some life long friends as a result. Sadly over the years we have lost a lot of wonderful and knowledgeable Morrie people but hopefully they live on in the memories of some of the amazing Morries they owned and that have been past on to future custodians.

Sunday 24th September**

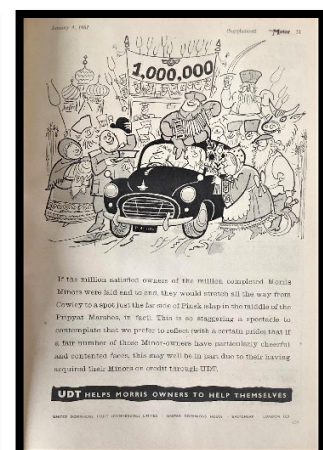
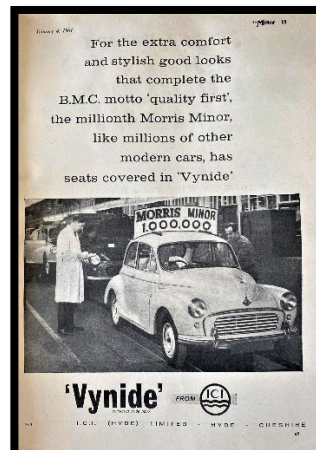
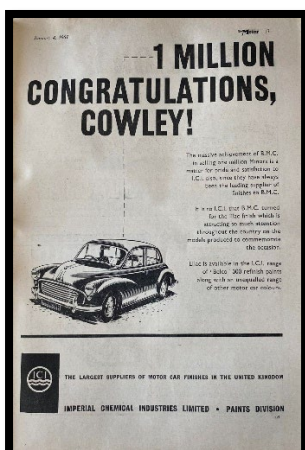

The drive will take us through Moorooduc, Dromana, Red Hill arriving at Arthur's Seat for a sightseeing/rest stop.



